PROSPECTUS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION:

- 1.1. Applications in the prescribed format are invited from intending candidates for admission into Diploma in Pharmacy course in the Government & Private Pharmacy Colleges of the State of Odisha in the academic session 2019-20. The D. Pharm. course is of 2 years Teaching followed by 3 months of compulsory apprenticeship Practical Training.
- 1.2. Selection for admission into D. Pharm. Colleges, approved by Pharmacy Council of India (except Government Polytechnics, Bhubaneswar & Centurion University of Technology and Management, Khurda) will be conducted by the D. Pharm. Selection Committee 2019-20 until otherwise directed by the Government.

The D Pharm Selection Committee 2019-20 shall consists of:

- 1.3. The details will be available in the website i.e. www.dmetodisha.gov.in in "Pharmacy Admission" section. The selection will be made by online process.
- 1.4. The Committee will function in the office of the DMET, Odisha, and will carry out the following works

The Selection Committee shall:

- a. Prepare a merit list of eligible candidates and complete the admission process.
- b. The Chairman will be the controlling & supervising authority and must see that the counselling and admission are done in strict conformity with the laws laid down. He will approve the budget of expenditure and will release funds in time for smooth counselling and admission.
- c. The Convener is authorized to file affidavits in legal matters on behalf of the Selection Committee, float advertisements, and convene meetings, verification of documents, conduct counselling and allotment of seats strictly as per the guidelines in consultation with the Selection Committee members. He is the custodian of all documents including vouchers of expenditure of selection process and will produce them as and when required. An account in nationalized bank shall be opened in the name of Convener for the purpose. The office of the Convener shall function in Pharmacy

Wing, S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack. The Convener shall return the balance money along with the statement of expenditure to the Chairman after the admission process is over to be deposited in the "ENTRANCE EXAMINATION FEES" account with DMET.

2. AVAILABILITY OF SEATS:

Availability of seats in Government & Private Pharmacy Colleges shall be notified separately:

85% of the seats of private institutions and all seats of Government institution (PharmacyWing, S.C.B. Medical College) will be available for State Quota and will be filled up by thecounselling process. Rest 15% seats of private institutions will be available for theManagement Quota and will be filled up by respective institutions.

If any seats remain vacant after the counselling is over, the same will be filled up at institutional level by the respective management as per eligibility criteria. These candidates are required to be produced before the Selection Committee for their document verification by **29.9.2019**.

3. RESERVATION OF SEATS:

The reservation policy is applicable only to the Applicants satisfying the eligibility clause 5.3 of the Prospectus. The reservation of seats is as follow: 12% of seats for Scheduled Tribes (ST), 8% seats for Scheduled Castes (SC), 5% for Physically Challenged (PH), 3% for children of Ex-Servicemen & Defence Personnel (DF) and 5% for children of Green Card Holders (GC).

Note:

- i. Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe persons who have migrated from the State of origin to some other State for the purpose of seeking education will be deemed to be Scheduled Caste/Tribe of the State of their origin and will be entitled to derive benefits of reservation from the State of origin and not from the State to which they have migrated. (Vide Govt. of India letter No. BC/16014.1.82-SC & BCD/dated 22nd Feb.1985.
- ii. In case of non-availability of candidates belonging to any reserved category, the unfilled seats will be filled up by the UR candidates.
- iii. 5% seats of the annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 the details is as per Appendix- I. This will be decided by a Medical Board. Candidates seeking admission under this category are to appear before the Board (date will be notified).

4. PROSPECTUS AND APPLICATION FORM

The prospectus can be downloaded from the Website http://www.dmetodisha.gov.in (Click PHARMACY ADMISSION). The candidates have to register and submit application online. After registration the candidates have to attend document verification and have to submit the original documents along with e- receipt of online payment of Rs.600/-(Rupees six hundred only). The counselling fee is not refundable. In case of emergency the candidates can send the documents for verification through an authorised person along with a authorisation letter.

5. ELIGIBILITY FOR APPLICATION

To be eligible to apply for D.Pharm. course the applicant must -

- 5.1. Have passed 10 +2 Science examination with Physics, Chemistry, Biology (Bioscience/Life-science) and/or Mathematics from C.H.S.E., Odisha or any examination equivalent to it, approved by PCI. Candidates must have passed individually in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics/Biology, both in theory as well as practical. Student of Vocational course& distance education/correspondence course are not eligible. The list of approved examinations is placed in Appendix 2.
- 5.2. Be 17 years of age as on 31.12.2019.

5.3.

5.3.1. Be a Native/Permanent Resident of Odisha. Such candidates shall furnish certificate of Nativity/Permanent Residentship of Odisha from appropriate authority.

OR

- 5.3.2. Son, daughter or spouses of:
- i) Employee of Govt. of Odisha.
- ii) Defence Personnel posted in Odisha/Employee of Govt. of India working in Odisha.
- iii) Member of All India Services (Odisha Cadre) serving within/outside Odisha.
- iv) Employee of Govt. of India Undertaking/Govt. of Odisha Undertaking located in Odisha.

Such claims should be supported by certificate of service of parents or spouse from competent Authority.

OR

5.3.3. Odia belonging to outlying Odia speaking tracks (as defined by Government of Odisha, P.& S. Dept., Resolution No.13411 Gen. dated 8.8.69, as amended from time to time). Such candidates must have Odia as M.I.L in H.S.C. or equivalent examination and shall furnish the certificate of authenticity of their domicile from an officer not below the rank of S.D.O. (Civil) of the locality and H.S.C. certificate showing Odia as M.I.L.

OR

5.3.4. An Indian National (including NRI) other than 5.3.1 & 5.3.3 mentioned above. But such candidates would be eligible for admission into Private Colleges only & not Government College, subject to condition that, their case would be considered after all candidates belonging to clause 5.3.1 to 5.3.3 are exhausted.

6. DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED DURING DOCUMENT VERIFICATION.

The following original certificates along with clear self attested photocopy (both sides of the document to be photocopied) should be produced before the Convener for verification.

(i) Pass certificate of H.S.C. or equivalent examination with M.I.L. and date of birth of candidate recorded therein (if the D.O.B./subjects are not written in the H.S.C. Certificate but appears on the Admit Card/Mark-sheet then the same is to be enclosed). Other certificates of age such as Certificate from Headmaster/Principal of the School/College, birth certificate from hospital or municipality etc. are not acceptable.

- (ii) Pass certificate of the qualifying examination showing the subjects studied.
- (iii) Mark-list of the qualifying examination.
- (iv) Conduct certificate from the Principal of the College last studied/gazetted officer (issued within last 6 months).
- (v) Caste/Tribe Certificate from the Revenue Officer of Odisha not below the rank of Tahasildar of the area to which the candidate belongs in case of applicant belonging to S.C./S.T. category. The name of the Caste/Tribe must appear in the Certificate and Schedule of Caste/Tribe of the Odisha (for S.C./S.T.) Rules, 1980.
- (vi) Physically Handicapped certificate issued by the Social Welfare/Panchayat Raj Department, Government of Odisha/District Social Welfare Officer in case of candidate claiming seat reserved for Physically Challenged (PH) candidates.(Certificate issued by Chief District Medical Officers will not be entertained).
- (vii) Green Card in the prescribed form from the Chief District Medical Officer of the concerned District in case of candidate claiming the seat reserved for children of "Green Card Holders". Thename, father's name &date of birth of the beneficiary must havebeen mentioned clearly on this certificate and should tally with the data mentioned in the High School certificate (If the D.O.B. differs then the GC facility will not beavailable). This facility of the green card must not have been used before by the same candidate.
- (viii) Certificatein the prescribed form from the Station Commander/Officer Commanding/Office-in-charge, Zilla/ Rajya Sainik Board in case of candidate claiming seats reserved for children of Ex-servicemen/Defence personnel.
- (ix) Residential/Nativity Certificate from Tahasildar, issued within one year.
 - OR Service Certificate of parent/spouse.
- (x) Online payment receipt.

7. SELECTION

- 7.1. Selection for admission shall be made on the basis of merit judged according to aggregate marks secured in Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Mathematics (whichever is more) in the qualifying examination. 1% of full mark shall be deducted from the percentage of this aggregate for each failure or dropping at the qualifying examination. (However appearing in instant examination would not liable for deduction of marks).
- 7.2. In case of candidates having equal marks in aggregate of Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Mathematics (whichever is more) in the qualifying examination *inter se* merit shall be decided as follows:
 - 7.2.1. According to the Grand total marks (with extra optional) secured at the qualifying examination in the first attempt. In case of further tie;
 - 7.2.2. According to the marks secured in biology at the qualifying examination. In case of further tie;
 - 7.2.3. According to the marks secured in Chemistry at the qualifying examination.
- 7.3 The merit list of the candidates shall be published in the website http://www.dmetodisha.gov.in.Objection to the merit list can be pointed out to the Convener personally or through e-mail (pwscbodisha@gmail.com). No separate intimation

will be sent to the candidates. The candidates are requested to be in touch with the web site (http://www.dmetodisha.gov.in) to avoid any information being missed.

8. COUNSELLING PROCEDURE:

- 8.1. All the candidates who wish to participate in counselling procedure for admission to D.Pharm. Course must **register** within due time through the DMET website i.e. http://www.dmetodisha.gov.in Pharmacy admission section. Registration means creating own username and password for log in to the site. Without registration the candidate cannot participate in the counselling. The user name and password must not be shared with others.
- 8.2. After log in to the site the candidate has to fill up the <u>online application</u> form and Online payment of Rs.600/- through <u>www.onlinesbi.com</u> i.e.SB collect followed by D.Pharm.Counselling fees 2019-20 and submit. A printout of the online application form and e-receipt of online payment must be taken.
- 8.3. The candidate has to attend the **document verification** session personally and get his/her online application authenticated. The candidate has to submit the e-receipt of online payment of **Rs.600/-**(Rupees six hundred only), self attested copies of documents along with originals. The counselling fee is not refundable. The name of eligible candidate will appear in the "merit list" after successful verification of documents.
- 8.4. Then the candidate has to submit his/her choice of college in order of preference in the online site and **lock the choice**.
- 8.5. College will be allotted on merit basis. The candidate can download the <u>allotment cum</u> <u>admission letter</u> and appear before the Convener (in Pharmacy Wing, S.C.B.MedicalCollege, Cuttack) on the notified date & time along with required admission fees. He/She will be issued provisional admission letter.
- 8.6. The candidate must **report before the authority of the institution** allotted with in stipulated date as notified.
- 8.7. If required a spot counselling would be held to fill up the vacant & consequential vacant seats. All the seats & all the candidates would be considered as General & no reservation policy would be applicable. Physical presence of the candidate is a must for participating the spot counselling. The candidate has to report before the reporting time. The candidates coming late will allotted a seat from the balance seats available at that point of time. The reported candidates will be called as per their merit. The case of candidate who has not taken admission will be considered only on production of CLC and admission fee. The candidates who surrender a seat will be available to the next candidate in merit. No roll-over of past candidates would be allowed.
- 8.8. If the candidate wants to resign after admission, then (s)he can do so by the schedule date. In such case his/her total admission fees will be refunded. If the candidate resign after counselling is over, no fees will be refunded.
- 8.9. Other detail procedures, schedules of counselling, choice locking, admission reporting will be notified by the Convener in the web site of the DMET (http://www.dmetodisha.gov.in)

as and when required. Candidates are requested to be in constant touch with the website till admission process is over.

8.10 The Private College authorities have to produce the list of Candidates admitted by the management against the Management Quota & vacant seats after counselling along with a copy of **Online Payment Receipt** towards verification fees @ **Rs.600/-** per candidate. Such candidates are to be produced before the Convener along with their original documents for verification within the stipulated date. The final list of candidates admitted, published by the Convener is final and binding.

9. ADMISSION

9.1. A selected candidate shall be provisionally admitted to the college by the Convener by submitting the allotment letter, CLC, required fees, & undertakings if any.

10.3. The candidate has to deposit the admission fees through online i.e. www.onlinesbi.com (no cash will be accepted). (For Govt. Colleges the fees to be deposited is Rs. 10,500/- and for private Colleges Rs. 15,000 and the rest amount i.e. Rs.40,000.00 (for Private Colleges only) shall be deposited to the concerned private college). After the process of admission is over the fees collected will be hand over to the respective institutions as per admission status.

11. REGISTRATION UNDER BOARD:

All the candidates thus admitted are required to be registered under the Odisha State Board of Pharmacy within the date notified by the Board, by paying the prescribed fee and submitting the required testimonials.

12. PROHIBITION OF RAGGING IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION:

Ragging is totally banned & prohibited in all the D.Pharm. institutions. Anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished including Cancellation of admission, Expulsion/Rustication from the College with debarring from admission to any other College and fine ranging from Rs.25,000/- to Rs.1,00,000/-. All students & their Guardian are required to go through "Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Educational Institutions" available in website http://pci.nic.in/PDF-Files/Menace-of-Ragging-new.pdf), framed by Pharmacy Council of India as per the guidelines of the Hon"ble Apex Court & give Undertakings as per the Regulation to the College admitted.

13. MISCELLANEOUS:

- a) A candidate who has been convicted of any criminal offence involving moral turpitude shall not be selected/admitted even though he/she may be otherwise eligible. In the event of concealment or misrepresentation of facts in this regard the admission shall be cancelled.
- b) After admission a candidate must abide by the Rules (including Hostel Rules) prescribed by the concerned institution.
- c) In all matters relating to eligibility or otherwise of a candidate for registration, selection and admission to D.Pharm. Course; the decision of the Committee shall be final and binding.
- d) All documents/records related to D.Pharm. admission 2019-20 will be preserved in the office of the Convener up to 30.06.2020.

Appendix I

(Refer Regulation 4 & 5)

A SCHEDULE is annexed regarding, "SPECIFIED DISABILITY" clause (zc) of section 2, that states as under,

1. Physical disability

A. Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

- (a) "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from— (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity; (ii)manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity; (iii)extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
- (b) "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
- (c) "dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
- (d) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
- (e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual impairment—

- (a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction— (i) total absence of sight; or (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
- (b) "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:— (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

C. Hearing impairment -

- (a) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- (b) "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- D."speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.
- 2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—
 - (a) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
 - (b) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.
- 3. Mental behaviour,— "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by subnormality of intelligence.

4. Disability caused due to-

(a) chronic neurological conditions, such as— (i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other; (ii) "parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-

aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

- (b) Blood disorder—
- (i) "haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor would may result in fatal bleeding;
- (ii) "thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.
- (iii) "sickle cell disease" means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.
- 5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.
- 6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

Note: Any amendment to the Schedule to the RPWD Act, 2016, shall consequently stand amended in the above schedule.
